

Dear Valued Corporate Customer,

Changes to Interbank GIRO

The upgrade of the Interbank GIRO infrastructure took place **on 23 March 2015**. Banks are no longer using branch codes to process GIRO transactions.

There will not be any impact to you as we will continue to accept all existing GIRO formats at Velocity@ocbc. You do not need to make any changes to your file formats and file format mapping immediately.

Your existing Interbank GIRO arrangements on your OCBC account(s) will also remain unchanged.

For new Interbank GIRO arrangements with OCBC (from 23 March 2015), you will be required to enter the full bank account number (refer to example below):

Current account (12-digit)	501123456001
Savings account (10-digit)	5011234567

Frequently Asked Questions:

1.	Which day in March 2015 will this be effective?
	The upgrade took place on 23 March 2015.
2.	When will I be required to enter the full bank account?
	You will be required to enter the full bank account number for GIRO transactions submitted from 23 March 2015.



3. What do you mean by the full account number?

The full bank account number will include the branch code followed by the existing account number.

For **OCBC**, **HSBC** and **State Bank of India**, you will need to include the branch code followed by the existing account number. Please see samples:

4. What is this upgrading about?

The upgrading will consist of some key improvements:

- Introduction of SWIFT Bank Identifier Code (BIC)
- Omission of Bank Codes (replaced by BIC) and Branch Codes when processing GIRO transactions.
- Expansion of account number field
 - o You will be able to key in your full bank account number
 - Prior to this upgrading, your account number consisted of the branch code and account number
- Provision of more payment information to identify your transaction

5. Do I need to remember a bank's BIC for my GIRO transaction via Velocity@ocbc after the implementation?

You are not required to memorise a bank's BIC as we will allow you to select the name of the bank that you wish to transfer to.

For file-upload submissions, there will not be any impact as we will continue to accept all existing GIRO formats on Velocity@ocbc.

You <u>do not</u> need to make any changes to your file formats and file format mapping immediately.

6. How does this impact me after GIRO has been upgraded?

Your existing interbank GIRO arrangements on your OCBC account(s) remain unchanged.

For new interbank GIRO arrangements with OCBC (from 23 March 2015), you will be required to enter the full bank account number (10 or 12 digit).



Do's and Don'ts for Billing Organisations

1) For the OLD GIRO Application Form

(Name of form: GIRO Application Format)

Do's

- Keep to the old format, including Bank and Branch code.
- · Account number should be 7 or 9 digit




Do's

- Indicate full account number (10 or 12 digit)
- Indicate OCBC Swift BIC correctly



Don'ts

Omitting Branch code and indicate only 7 or 9 digit account number
