OCBC BANK PRICES A\$500 MILLION OF SENIOR FLOATING RATE GREEN NOTES DUE 2024

Oversea-Chinese Banking Corporation Limited (“**OCBC Bank**”) has priced A\$500 million of senior floating rate green notes due 2024 (“**Notes**”) under its US\$30 billion Global Medium Term Note Program (“**Program**”). The Notes will be issued by OCBC Bank, acting through its Sydney Branch, and are expected to be Repo Eligible by the Reserve Bank of Australia. The net proceeds from the issue of the Notes will be used to finance or refinance new or existing qualifying assets which meet the Eligibility Criteria for Green Bonds under the OCBC Sustainability Bond Framework.

The Notes will be issued at an issue price of 100.00% and bear interest at the 3-month Bank Bill Swap reference rate plus 0.26% per annum, payable quarterly in arrear. The Notes are expected to be rated Aa1 by Moody’s Investors Service, Inc., AA- by S&P Global Ratings and AA- by Fitch Ratings Ltd, and are expected to be issued on 12 August 2021.

Australia and New Zealand Banking Group Limited, Commonwealth Bank of Australia, National Australia Bank Limited, OCBC Bank and UBS AG, Singapore Branch acted as Joint Lead Managers for this issue.

An application will be made for the listing of the Notes on the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited (“**SGX-ST**”) and the Notes are expected to be listed on the SGX-ST on 13 August 2021. The SGX-ST assumes no responsibility for the correctness of any of the statements made or opinions or reports contained herein. Admission of the Notes to the Official List of the SGX-ST is not to be taken as an indication of the merits of OCBC Bank, the Program or the Notes.
